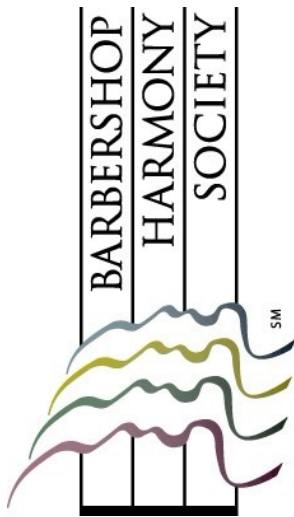


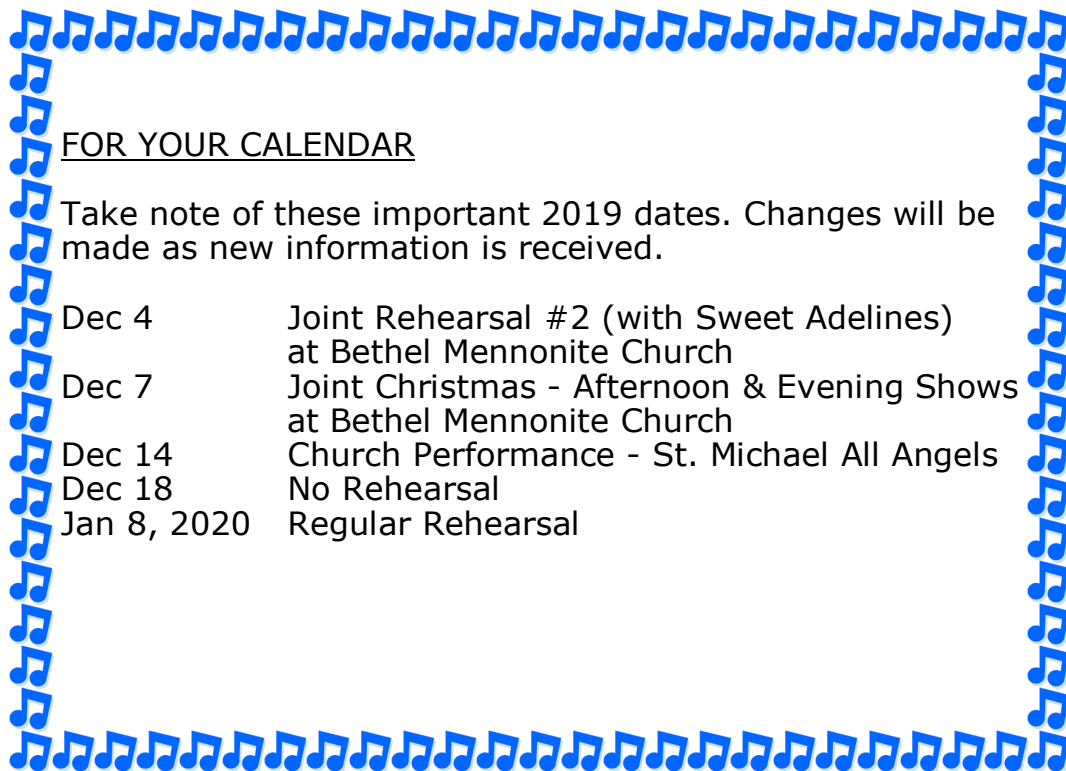

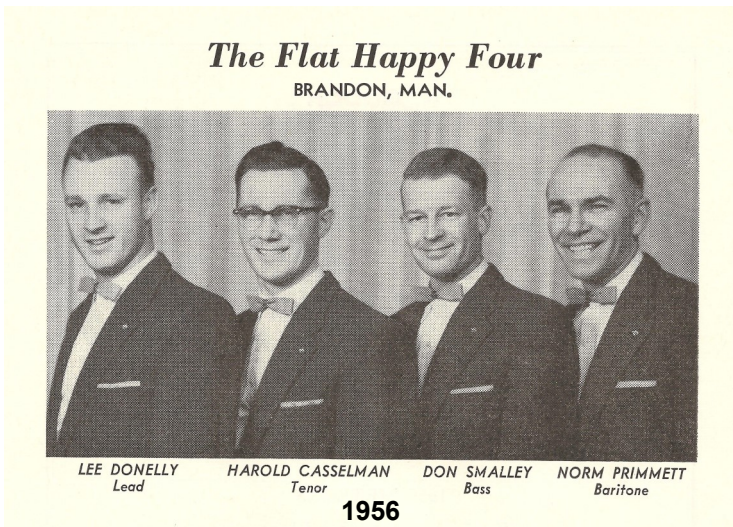

Change in Membership and Chapter Dues

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Please find below a resolution that was passed at the District Convention on October 25, 2019:

"That the current \$9.00 Chapter Assessment be discontinued and replaced with a \$10.00 Member's Dues increase (from \$24 to \$34)"

- This change results in a net increase to the District of \$1 per member by reorganizing the revenue stream from the Chapter Assessment to the Member's dues.
- The assessment amount \$9 plus \$1 more would now be paid by the individual member, making LOL Member's Dues \$34, just below the average of all 17 Districts.
- This \$10 annual increase would be the only member's dues increase since 2007. This is about an 83 cents a year increase
- General membership and member's participation in Conventions, Leadership Academy, etc has dropped considerably since 2007, mainly due to aging.
- This results in less revenue as most District revenue has come from the Chapters' \$9 per member assessment (Policy 10.03 set in 2011) and Member's \$24 District dues (Policy 10.01 set in 2007)
- The District has instituted, and is contemplating a variety of additional, cost cutting measures to reduce expenses and is looking at other creative ways to increase revenue outside of membership dues.
- This would eliminate the District and Chapter's assessment billing and payment process.
- The Chapter would retain the assessment amount, that they are currently paying, for its own operations.
- While any increase in dues is uncomfortable, the cost to our Members is still less than \$3/month and that supports the District's ability to continue to deliver value through programs like: education/support programs for Chapters/choruses/quartets, Pitch Piper, Leadership Academy, conventions & contests, YIH, support for chorus/quartets representing LOL at International, etc.

Bottom line - The Chapter will not be assessed the \$9 District dues from International. Members will be charged an incremental \$10 when they renew their membership after January 1, 2020. To minimize the impact on Chapter members, the Executive has decided that chapter dues will be decreased from the current \$80 per year to \$70 per year effective January 1, 2020.

Any questions on this change in dues structure should be directed to myself. Thank you.

Deadlines & Details for “The Wonder of Christmas” by Brian Metcalfe

With only two rehearsals prior to our Christmas show on Dec. 7th, members need to focus on finalizing ticket sales. Since this performance will be our major money-making event this year, we are encouraging all members to sell a minimum of two tickets to our show. Please email me (bkmnetcalfe@shaw.ca) in advance and I'll make sure you get additional tickets. Although I'll provide you with tickets as needed, on our final rehearsal on Wed. Dec. 4th, I will need to receive, in exchange, the equivalent payment in the form of a cheque.

- **Nov. 27 Rehearsal** - If you have completed all your ticket sales, you may return any unsold tickets (hopefully very few) with a cheque made payable to the “Winnipeg Golden Chordsmen” in an envelope.
- **Dec. 4 Rehearsal – Bethel Mennonite Church** – All unsold tickets and payment must be returned to me on this date. Please convert any cash into a personal cheque made payable to the “Winnipeg Golden Chordsmen”. Place these sales items in an envelope with the following information on the outside:
 - Your name
 - Number of Afternoon &/or Evening ticket received
 - Number of Afternoon &/or Evening ticket sold
 - Cheque amount(s) for all ticket sales
 - # of unsold Afternoon &/or Evening tickets

This attention to detail will help me to quickly retrieve all outstanding ticket sales at this very busy rehearsal “walk-through”.

Please note that if unsold tickets are not returned to me on or before Dec. 4th, the RCS member will be responsible for purchasing these tickets and turning the respective funds over to me in a cheque. In other words, **any tickets retained after this Dec. 4th cut-off date will be considered sold.**



- **Dec. 4 Rehearsal - NO UNPAID TICKETS AT THE DOOR** - Remember, there can be no unpaid tickets left at the door. If you wish to provide tickets in an envelope for friends or family and have them pick them up at the door, you must pay for them in advance, out of your own pocket. Then these tickets can be placed in an envelope with the patron's name, Afternoon or Evening show, and the words “Paid For In Full” entered on the envelope. Please give this ticket envelope to Brian Metcalfe no later than Dec 4th. Brian, in turn, will pass these paid for tickets on to the Ticket Sellers at the door. You then, can negotiate with your friends or family as to when you are repaid for your investment of these tickets. Taking such action on Dec. 4, will avoid having the Ticket Sellers try to search out a chorus member who has the tickets in their pants or purse on the day of the performance.

We trust that all RCS members will do their best to adhere to these deadline dates and instructions to reduce the stress on our dedicated ticket management volunteers. Thank you.

Usher Needed for Afternoon Christmas Show by Brian Metcalfe

Unfortunately, as River City Sound performers, we often think that without us on the risers, there would be no Christmas or annual show. Although this is true, it is most important that we not forget the jobs that our spouses or family members or non-performing colleagues take on. For example, over the last several years, the following volunteers have been a key to the success of our shows and their continued commitment and dedication should not be over-looked:

- Jo-Anne Muldrew & Sally Metcalfe – Ticket sellers at the door
- Barbara Hirt & David Petrie – Ticket takers & program distributors
- Mary Latham – Usher

These individuals have agreed to once again help out at the afternoon (2:30 pm) Christmas show on Dec. 7th. Observant readers will note that although the previous volunteers work in pairs, there is only one Usher identified for the up-coming "The Wonder of Christmas" afternoon performance on Saturday, Dec. 7th.

It is critical that we get one additional volunteer to help Mary usher at our afternoon Christmas show. Please have a spouse or adult son or daughter contact me (bkmetcalfe@shaw.va) indicating that they can help usher.

The responsibilities of ushers include:

- Arrive at 1:30 pm (as the doors will open at 1:45 pm).
- Prior to the show, meet patrons with walker/wheelchairs, attach an ID tag # to their mobility device, and give the individual a duplicate copy of their ID tag #.
- Store their walker/wheelchair with ID tag # in the rear of the church narthex.
- Following the show, get the patron's ID tag #, retrieve the walker/wheelchair from the narthex, and return it to the owner.

Finding this last volunteer usher completes my task of identifying the necessary helpers for the afternoon show from family & friends of River City Sound members, since the Assiniboine Chorus are responsible for all volunteers at the evening show.

Thank you for your consideration and action on this desperate request.

Wardrobe for Shows

Following is the wardrobe for the upcoming Christmas shows:

For the Joint Show with Assiniboine Show Chorus (Dec 7th)

First half of Show:

Women RCS members and LTSB participants:

Black pants or skirt, black top, black shoes and hosiery (if needed), medium blue accents - jewellery, scarf, bolero, etc

Men RCS members:

Black shoes and socks, black pants (can be tuxedo pants), plain white long sleeved shirt, blue chorus vest, long blue tie that matches the vest.

LTSB men:

Black shoes, socks, pants, plain white long sleeved shirt, blue vests (on loan from RCS).

Second half of Show:

Women:

Same basic wardrobe but replacing the blue accents with lots of 'bling' (rhinestones, flashy belts, shiny bolero, etc)

RCS Men:

Black tuxedo, white pleated tuxedo shirt with wing collar, striped grey/silver vest, red bow tie

LTSB Men:

Black pants, plain white long sleeved shirt, long red tie (on loan from RCS)

The grey/silver vests for chorus members and the red bow ties are available at each rehearsal. Please get your as soon as possible in case alterations are needed.

For the RCS-only church shows (Dec 1 and 14)

Women:

Black shoes and hose, black pants / skirt, white blouse, red accents (belt, scarf etc)

Men:

Black shoes and socks, black pants, plain white long sleeved shirt, long red chorus tie.
