

# MESSAGE FROM LES CREEK

As per earlier email:

This week's Wednesday rehearsal does not have any designated sectional time. As we work through the music and choreo for the pieces, we'll determine if a sectional is needed for any specific song. If it is, we'll break out into a sectional.

The next 3 weeks will be busy, but this is usually the case before a show. I want to recognize and thank all the people involved in creating the show and in making it come to life. There are so many of you, and you have done a stellar job. I'm really looking forward to it, and to the Afterglow. The chorus wouldn't be what it is without so many willing volunteers and their supportive families. #### "DIAMONDS FROM STAGE & SCREEN": TICKETS & TIPS by Brian Metcalfe

Who needs a show ticket? - This important question was asked of me by a "Learn to Sing Better" member. Performers in our annual performance, on May 13th, do not need to purchase a show ticket. Family and friends who come to see you perform must ac quire a \$25 ticket. Children 12 and under do not need a ticket but will be admitted by the ticket-takers at the front entrance to Prairie Spirit United Church. Since all tickets are rush seating, advise friends and family to arrive early, when the doors open at 1:30 pm or at 6:00 pm, so that they can get the best seats.

How to get show tickets? Tickets can be acquired in the following ways: 1) Email Brian Metcalfe (bkmetcalfe@shaw.ca) before noon each Wednesday and Brian will provide you with an envelope with your tickets at the next rehearsal. 2) Those who wish to purchase tickets online, may contact Eventbrite.ca at: - AFTERNOON: https://diamonds-afternoon.eventbrite.ca

- EVENING: https://diamonds-evening.eventbrite.ca
- 3) Tickets (costing \$25) may be purchased at the door with cash or cheque (made paya ble to River City Sound).


Why does Brian request that you email him in advance with your ticket needs? Those that know Brian, understand that he is very "analytical". In fact, some might sug gest that his outlook is much more focused on the first four letters of the previous itali cized attribute :-) Brian spends long hours creating spreadsheets and accurately record ing ticket distribution to track sales so as to balance sales perfectly.

However, Brian does not work well under pressure when requests for tickets are made in the limited time during rehearsal. Many things can go wrong when rushing. Brian prefers to work at home, at his leisure, to prepare ticket envelopes in advance. This attention to detail and need for accuracy was fostered when Brian was first asked to manage ticket sales within our chorus at the door of the 2015 Christmas show. Over the past eight years, our ticket distribution process, fund balancing, and our walk-up ticket sales at the door have improved dramatical ly and our chorus members have worked hard to keep Brian sane.



#### What process should be used for returning ticke t sales funds and unsold tickets?

This year's "Diamonds From Stage & Screen" is less than 3 weeks away! The deadline for all ticket ets sales is on or before our last rehearsal on Wednesday, May 10th. At this rehearsal, all ticket revenue (which we hope is large) and any returned tickets (which we hope are small) must be turned into Brian Metcalfe in an envelope together with a cheque(s) made payable to the "River City Sound". Brian would appreciate that each person provides him with an envelope containing: your name, the number of tickets re ceived, the number of tickets sold, and the number of tickets returned (if any). Indicate the sales total value on the outside of the envelope and convert all cash sales to a per sonal cheque which you enclose in the envelope. Believe me, with all the tasks that need to be accomplished at this last rehearsal before our show, Brian will appreciate your support in this.





#### NO UN-PAID SHOW TICKETS WILL BE HELD IN RESERVE AT THE DOOR

If a chorus member wishes to reserve a ticket for a patron, and the patron is not able to pick up and pay for the ticket before hand, the chorus member must purchase the ticket out of his/her own pocket and submit payment to Brian Metcalfe as noted above. Such a "reserved & paid ticket" should be placed in an envelope which is marked as follows:

- 1. the patron's name;
- 2. the number of tickets:
- 3. either AFTERNOON or EVENING; and
- 4. the words "PAID TICKETS".

This "paid & reserved ticket" envelope should be given to Brian Metcalfe, on or before Wednesday, May 10th, who will pass it along to the ticket taking volunteers at the door.

REMEMBER: Any tickets in your possession after the rehearsal on Wednesday, May 10th, will be considered SOLD and the chorus member will be expected to purchase such tickets.


