THE WINNIPEG CANOE CLUB AND OUR WINNIPEG CHAPTER

Gordon Billows—Wpg Chapter Historian



PART 1—On Tues. May 23, I accompanied my wife Paula to her Assiniboine Chorus performance at the Winnipeg Canoe Club Condominiums on Dunkirk Dr. I usually attend their performances to take pictures for them and I always enjoy their performances. However, this performance was special to me, because back in the 1970's, I and several close friends were Canoe Club members. We enjoyed paddling up and down the Red River and, afterwards, having a few "bubblies" and socializing with all the other male and female members. This picture is the Canoe Club in 1947. It burnt down in 1954 and was rebuilt and included a golf course and swimming pool. It was very well known for all its sport and social events.



The Singing Souvenirs

While the Assiniboine Chorus was warming up, I wandered around and talked with several residents (mostly females, of course) about the chorus they would be hearing. I mentioned that Assiniboine used to be with Sweet Adelines, that I was a Barbershopper, and was a former member of the Canoe Club. I could see that this all brought back good memories for the ladies, because several of them mentioned that they also were former Canoe Club members. One lady remembered that a wonderful Barbershop Chorus sang for them there. The Winnipeg Golden Chordsmen, of course! I am sure that the Club's dances, canoe trips, parties, sporting and social events we all enjoyed in our earlier days, were some of the determining factors that led a few of these ladies to choose that condominium for their retirement residences. They had many fond memories at that location. One lady mentioned that her husband was a Barbershopper, "but that was a long time ago". I asked his name. It was George Leopp and I was

talking to his wife, Leslie. Being a member of Wpg Chapter for almost 45 years, of course, I knew George. George Leopp was a member from 1972 to 1985, Chapter President and Barbershopper of the Year in 1975 and sang Lead with the several Wpg Chapter quartets—Singing Souvenirs, Major Decision and Original Cast.



PART 2—Little did I know that my experiences at the Canoe Club were similar to those of our Chapter's founders. Back in the late 1940's, and probably earlier, on Sunday afternoons, many Club members would paddle along the Red singing the popular songs from that era. Residents along the shorelines applauded the "performers". After docking, many members would gather around a piano in the main "party" room or on the veranda for a "sing-a-long" and continue singing/harmonizing and socializing well into the evening. In the early 1940's, some members of the Canoe Club enjoyed singing as quartets, like the Catfish Colony Four and the Ashpit Four. These quartet members became the founding members of the Winnipeg Chapter. Two of them, Charlie Brenan and Jack Galbraith, were the main Wpg Chapter organizers who petitioned the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America for Winnipeg to become a Chapter. The rest is HISTORY! I am sure that Shirley Christie has stories about many Wpg Chapter events in the "early days" because her late husband, Bill, joined the Chapter in 1955!

MESSAGE FROM THE SHOW PRODUCER




